ALBANY — Wayne Hogan, age 69 of Albany, died Thursday, March 30, 2006 at his residence. Graveside services will be at 2 p.m., Sunday, April 2nd in the Albany Cemetery with Rev. Don Clevenger officiating. Burial will be under the direction of Morehart Mortuary.

Thomas Wayne Hogan was born January 13, 1937 in Gorman to parents Clyde Lee Hogan and Geneva Alice Jones Hogan. He graduated from Albany High School in 1955 and married Wanda Lorena Jones on August 27, 1955 in Albany. Wayne and Wanda owned and operated The Longhorn Restaurant in Albany for over 30 years.
